Pages of hope

Ojai artist/author unveils her series of inspirational books

The results can be seen in Journeys, a new series of inspirational gift books that pair the Ojai artist's introspective writings and soft-focus paintings of flowers, trees and rolling landscapes.


Printed by Exley
Publications Ltd., in Great
Britain, the small books (they
measure about 61/4 by 43/8
inches) were introduced at the
Frankfurt Book Fair in
October and in the United
States in January. Florence
will read from their pages
during appearances on April
12 at the Barnes & Noble in
Ventura and again on April 24
at Tottenham Court Tea Room
in Ojai.

Among the titles is "Your Journey ... A Passage Through a Difficult Time," which explores the issue of grief through paintings of rainsoaked mountains and of a sun-dappled arrangement of flowers on a kitchen table. "Peace may come with the early morning sunlight streaming in your window," reads the accompanying text.

Also in the series is "On the Gift of a Mother's Love," inspired by Florence's own experiences as mom to Brent and Emily.

"How Wonderful it is ... Having Friends in Our Lives" features a painting of a Matilija poppy on the cover.

Other visual clues to the artist's home in Ventura County can be seen throughout the slender, full-color books, which sell for \$9 each. "When You Lose

Someone You Love" includes a seascape that looks very like one of the Channel Islands. Several books feature studies of hillsides that could pass for Ventura's Two Trees landmark.
